12 May 2010 Kentucky Learning Depot Content Team

Present: Enid, Cecelia, Cindy, Betsy
Guest: Dave,

Team notes: Vince, Lesia, Paula, and Brian couldn't make it today.

5/12 To do: Need to elect or assign new team leaders. Paula and Lesia cannot continue in this role.

1. Depot Launch - Follow-up:

We will have 2 lists for potential content – one for websites and one for portals.

- o List of Websites from Dr. Bonk's talk
- o List of Portals or Repositories – Cindy and Miko have posted an alphabetical list in our work space which is based on the Florida's Blueprint site.

Dr. Bonk's portals can be added to this list. 3/10 Notes: Cindy will look for these lists. Thinks the list is in his powerpoint.

4/14 – Cindy: Went to the "Perfect e-Storm" ppt and despite the massive number of slides, the number of slides with URLs was actually small and she didn't see any that were a good fit for the Depot. Cindy is working her way through Bonk's book "The World is Open" and while she is doing that, she's also reviewing the websites he lists within each chapter. Cindy is compiling a list of potential sites to review in the future.

5/12 update: WIO is very dense, heavy ready [which is great] but doesn't make the list compilation task very easy. Will take months.

We will then divide and conquer by breaking them down to chunks so team members can

review them and contribute to the Depot.

Follow-up – Vince and Paula will review.

3/10 Notes: Vince was NOT at the Nov 2009 meeting. Vince & Paula - this is quality content. BUT, per Vince, the items with lower hit rates are not as high quality. Suggest we do not pull in the entire SAS but choose the better quality. Paula's MOA with KDE is ending and she cannot volunteer for any large/labor intensive projects.

3/10 Notes: Vince will do a little more in-depth review before reporting back to the team. 1000's of items. Also look at their eval criteria.

4/14 – Vince: He's been looking at the SAS site. Very good content, and then, not so much – based on hits, the lower numbers aren't necessarily quality. Site doesn't run in every browser, need ActiveX and Java. In places that the browser is locked down, user won't be able add the plugins. Also must turn off your popup blocker.

That said, he looked at 3 content areas: Science, Math and History [Civil War]. Each discipline has a different look/feel. Very well done. Math was extremely well done.

Looks like the hired people to create these items. \$75million to create these objects/pathways via organizational or grant funds. Need to look around to find the content.

Kentucky ranks 10th in using this product, according to the SAS site – by some sort of IP map perhaps? Can't tell.

Vince – 1024 x 768 screen but he thinks the display can be problematic as the font can get really small.

Let's send it through to the discipline reviewers. Probably could pull the first 50 from each discipline OR start with the first 5 for review. Thinks the resources, from the Sciences for example, were oriented to 9-12th grades. Math, probably could go to early college level. Social Science has video with it.

There is some redundancy with some topics covered several times.

Enid is talking with Lesia Friday this week. Enid will bring up the SAS review – should the top 10 items be inputted to the Depot for assignment to the scholars? Or could the scholars review these outside the system? [Enid 4/14 note]

5/12 Note: Enid talked with Lesia, we should submit content as we look at it and then it will be reviewed by the scholars. May need to revamp the workflow this summer but for now, content gets contributed [choosing grade level, media type, etc.], it gets assigned to a

reviewer and then passed on for tagging at UofL. More work for us, the Content Team, but as we increase our group number, we'll be in better shape to handle it.

University Press of Kentucky – They are willing to use Depot as an avenue for their publications.
3/10 Notes: Enid, find notes on contacts, responsible, status for next mtg.

4/14 – Cecelia will look at the Intelecom site and get back to us.

5/12 Note: Cecelia hasn't had a chance to look at this yet. Enid will send Cecelia the info from the rep that she's received.

Open Textbooks – These need to be selected to be included in the Depot collection.
Follow-up – Walt, Sandy and Paula will work on this.

3/10 Notes: Enid follow up w/Walt and Sandy on the Open Textbooks. Paula cannot.

3/10 Notes: Paula needs to drop out of this task. Enid will follow-up with Sandy. Walt?
Cast the net out to the team listserv for volunteers.

4/14 Enid: Brian volunteered to look for K12 resources. Enid will forward the 2 documents she has with open text lists and also, email Sandy, Walt and Brian so all 3 will be in the same conversation.

5/12: Enid will nudge Sandy and Walt again. Brian couldn't be here so we don't know where he is with the K12 piece.

Other Repositories – New sites need to be selected to be included.
Follow-up - Cindy and Vince will coordinate the addition of Dr. Bonk's portals into our list and start divide and conquer task.

3/10 Notes: Cindy will look for the lists. Also will help vet the content.

4/14 – Cindy: Went to the "Perfect e-Storm" ppt and despite the massive number of slides, the number of slides with URLs was actually small and she didn't see any that were a good fit for the Depot.

3. Depot website - Featured Depot Content.

Need volunteers from this team to prepare a list for us to swap out "Featured Content" every 4 to 6 weeks.

3/10 Notes: Need collection name and description/annotation. Highlighting what's in the Depot. If everyone could send in 2 or 3 items, we would easily cover the year.

4/14 Cindy: She's been looking for items but is running into textbook chapters. But she is running into

permission problems, as if she doesn't have access.

4/14 Enid: Enid will talk with Lesia about moving this task over to the scholars – they've not had much to do and we need to keep them "in the game."

5/12 Update from Enid: Talked with Lesia. Lesia's contract ends in June. The Scholars must be asked to continue as volunteers. Enid will talk Al and plan to solicit recommendations from the Depot Steering Team. Steering Team meets on 20 May.

5/12 Update from Cindy: Sent Betsy her first summary of a site to put in the highlighted content area of the Kentucky Learning Depot. Working on her 2nd.

5/12 Note: Still need write-ups of content for the Featured Content area. PRIORITY ITEM!!

4. Next Meeting is 14 April, 9am. And then we're back on the quarterly schedule.

Next meeting was set for quarterly on July 14 but the team has voted to go to monthly and retain our forward movement. Next is May 12, 9am.

5. Membership expansion. Our team is relatively small but the tasks are large. How can we grow this team? Do you have recommendations for colleagues to be recruited?

3/10 Notes: Need Steering Team to make recommendations.

Need Murray, UK, WKU. Nicole will pull Convergence list and look for potential team members.

4/14 Enid: Enid will forward Nicole's list to the group, the team will review the list and make suggestions for potential team mates.

5/12 Note: Enid WILL forward this to the group.

Enid - contact Kris Kimel at KSTC, re: involvement and representation. Vince is on the advisory for Ky Space. UK/Morehead connection.

6. Other items/discussion.

3/10 Notes: Need to update workplan. Last revision Nov 2008.

Nicole is about to have her baby, anytime in the next three weeks. She cannot volunteer for new projects.

Cindy & Vince needs her login. We will send everyone their login.

5/12 Update: Dave has done this – sent emails with password reset info to those who needed it.

4/14 Enid: Dave sent everyone their logins but passwords cannot be seen. Passwords can be reset, if anyone has forgotten theirs. Brian and Cecelia were not in the system. They'll email Dave their info to be setup. Dave will check Cindy's permissions. Everyone else should poke around the Depot to verify they have full access.

Deb & Carol - thought they were under the Scholars group. Enid will email Lesia and get them transitioned over.

4/14 Enid: Enid sent their info to Lesia. They both have received their scholars training packets and one of them has even done a review. They have been removed from the listserv.
